- 1989** Fabrication facility (Cincinnati) was established as an 8,000 square foot facility employing three trained and skilled mechanics
- 1999** Columbus distribution facility opens
- 2014** Thirty-six company vehicles on the road

- 2020** Exceeds 6,000,000 safe man hours

COMPANY GROWTH

- 1953** Bill Teepe begins his own plumbing company - William J. Teepe Inc. in Cincinnati, Ohio
- 1959** Jim Croson opens J.A. Croson in Columbus, Ohio
- 1980** Franklin Fire, a subsidiary of J.A. Croson, is started
- 1983** The company transforms into Teepe's River City Mechanical by adding HVAC to their plumbing expertise
- 1990** Steve and Scott Teepe takeover ownership from their father, Bill Teepe
- 1998** Teepe's River City Mechanical, J.A. Croson and Franklin Fire merge to form Croson-Teepe Mechanical
- 1999** Croson-Teepe Mechanical joins American Plumbing and Mechanical
- 2003** Scott Teepe and his management partners purchase AMPAM Commercial Midwest and form Teepe & Partners Mechanical, Inc., publicly known as TP Mechanical
- 2015** Scott Teepe sells his majority share to Bill Riddle and Tim Teepe
- 2019** TP Mechanical is a \$120 million mechanical contractor
- 2022** TP Mechanical joins TriplePoint – a regional corporation leading full-line mechanical companies to optimize their operations and growth
